

******* Note that we will cross the largest river of the northern hemisphere, the mighty Mississippi [The Ojibway Indians of northern Minnesota called it "Messipi" or "Big River," and it was also known as the "Mee-zee-see-bee" or the "Father of Waters." European explorers who mapped all the river's channels and backwater areas called it a "gathering of waters." Native Americans of different tribes who originally lived near the Mississippi and used it for canoe transportation, hunting, and fishing, often viewed the great river as the center of the universe.].
